WHY IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO VERIFY IF THERE IS FRAUD

During my criminal proceedings, there were two acts of document fraud, including one of document alteration by the plaintiff my sister. During 2024 April and May (my father died in August), there were two counts of someone impersonating my father by signature and name printed underneath of registered post letter I sent to 19 Carson Grove.

Naturally I feel sure Viju is someone potentially capable of document fraud in probate matters as well. I feel it would be a step forward if we did prove fraud if it did happen.

Can document analysis experts testifying be of any country in Europe? You know how these services are much cheaper in certain European countries than in Ireland and the UK?

CHATGPT Says that qualified reports of document fraud examiners usually say there is a likelihood or high likelihood of fraud. Rarely can they be 100% certain. I suppose the court decides one way or another with the expert report.

A young Pakistani chap who has a degree in forensic accounting knows how to do these forensic tests for document alteration but doesn't as yet have a license. He said he will take a look at them and get back to me after some time but he he will not give a written report only comments.

I think to verify a paper document they use an electron microscope and stuff like that. It's going to cost a lot less to have formal document examination of a digital file by an expert than a paper file by an expert.

In our will(3 sheets) and letter of wishes(2 sheets), The metadata has been purged from the digital files (will letter of wishes) and they have been flattened before transmission.

Chat GPT says I should ask my sister to re-send the scans. This time they should be done on a flatbed scanner, 600 dots per inch. She should be instructed no metadata removal allowed no flattening and absolutely no alteration of the raw scans, send them as they are. The scans which a png or pdf should be sent from her own email address from her own computer.

If my sister is given such instructions by you, I doubt she will co-operate. You decide. Maybe she can be asked to take the scans to someone YOU trust??

I would also like the 2021 will and notarized copies of my mother and father's passports. This will assist in future document examination should it happen. Due to the computer age, forgery of signature only happens by taking the person's real signature from one document and transferring it to another.

I have intermediate computer skills as compared to the lay person. I think pixel-by-pixel replacement around the edges of a cut-and-pasted region is a fairly low level skill, although it could take hours. When large amounts of money are involved, someone might undertake it. It's just that many people don't know about it, not that it is difficult.

The digital files can be blown up to show the individual pixels, on free photoshop resources online. As this is a flattened document nothing will show on a error level analysis tool. There are some smudges in the blown up document, minor difference in shade of rectangular regions, in the blank areas, which could be a cut and paste and also some pink regions showing up in a clone test closer to signatures. Chat GPT says these are suggestive but not conclusive of cut-and-pasting.

I would have to understand more and I would have to have an expert look at these documents to see if they can help
