Subject Access – Section 45, Data Protection Act 2018

The Data Protection Act 2018 places an obligation on the police when holding personal data to provide a copy of that data to the individual concerned upon request, unless an exemption applies.

From the personal details supplied in your request, please find enclosed the data held about you on the Police National Computer (PNC). This will only include your nominal data, any arrests, convictions, reprimands and warnings and disposals and, if applicable, information relating to firearms certificates.

Your disclosure is for personal use only – you are NOT obligated to provide this to a third party.

ACRO Criminal Records Office provides a subject access disclosure service on behalf of the majority of UK police forces for data held on PNC.

When a police force creates and updates records on the PNC in respect of their investigations, then the Chief Officer is the *Controller* for that data in accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018; and as such, they are responsible for ensuring that the data is lawfully managed.

When a police force creates and updates records on the PNC on behalf of a Non-Police Prosecuting Agency (NPPA) then the Chief Officer is the *Processor* of that data.

Whilst ACRO facilitates subject access and PNC record deletion for members of the public and police forces, ACRO cannot rectify or amend data owned by another police force or NPPA. ACRO is unable to resolve any data disputes regarding any inaccurate data held on the PNC, unless that data has been recorded by ACRO.

To exercise your right to rectification or to raise a data dispute regarding your personal data recorded on PNC, you will need to contact the relevant police force(s) or NPPA responsible for the record. You should be able to identify the relevant police force(s) or NPPA from the enclosed PNC report.

For certain non-conviction events which relate to you and are held on your PNC record, you may be eligible to apply for an event to be reviewed by the police under the Record Deletion Process. Further information can be found here under the 'Record Deletion' section:
