C) The release of my passport by the Canadian authorities was up to them. The US embassy in Calgary agreed to give me a visitor visa, B1, but my CA deportation officer decided to retain my passport, I was given legal advice that I was free to enter the US if that was what I wished. I could enter at a Border Patrol Office of the United States. At this point, the Americans would have the legal right to accept me or refuse me entry into the United States. If I was refused, I would take the other option- to return to Canada.

F) At the university, my supervisor was not okay and did not want me after six months. The university authorities told me I could have a different supervisor or take any course I wished. Under the advice and support of university officials, I went on medical leave for 2 semesters, which is 1 year.

I was doing a summer course when immigration CIC came to our home and arrested me. I had found my true love a university alumnus, we were very happy together.

My supervisor who got rid of me alleged my father in India was contacting him frequently and gave me an email from my father. The email said my father was worried about me as I was a missing

person.

This was a lie told by my father as he was calling daily in my wee hours and certainly, I was far from missing. CIC Canada immigration officers said my father was calling them (Canadian government and senior offices) and telling them I was a schizo head, and to deport me, his "baby born psychiatric" into his custody.

In Feb 1998, I relocated to Calgary in connection with my pending deportation. I only intended to visit a lawyer, but CIC did not permit me to return from Calgary to Saskatoon to my boyfriend. I could live free of arrest, and deportation if I stayed out of the province of SK, over which the officers who disliked me had jurisdiction. In 1998 I met Nicholas Hersom in Calgary and fell in love with him. On 13 December 1999 my deportation to India was scheduled. The CIC chief wanted to turn a blind eye if I wanted to go to the US.

I had a letter of goodwill from an INS officer who said to use that letter in case I wanted to return to the US. My father was jealous and confiscated this letter.

My short-term passport was varied to full-term.

Nicholas Hersom came to Madras from Korea to collect me. My parents attended a church ceremony arranged by Nick but were angry about me taking on a foreign religion. The photos from the ceremony got mysteriously lost by the photo studio. The pastor was coming to our home (my parents' home where I was staying with Nick)and my father planned to use a bizarre Indian law to put the pastor in jail when he arrived, and mysteriously the pastor did not turn up.

My mother wanted to prevent us from having a wedding night. I knew of my granny's abandoned house, where water and electricity were not properly turned on. I knew my long-dead granny would not mind if we stayed there.

That's where I had my honeymoon with Nick.

This disaster was only averted as Nick did not know how to get to the Airport unaided. He started disrespecting me due to my mother's copious phone calls when she gave him wrong ideas about me.

Already spoken to a legal advisor before coming to Ireland and met them in person. Handed my bus ticket -bus from Europa - to IPO -Irish International Protection Office - who wanted proof and when and how I entered Ireland. Told the Irish immigration officers about a trumped-up criminal conviction and subsequent notice to exclude me for the public good. Had asylum related British holographic ID and I surrendered that as well to the IPO.

Mohini Hersom's affidavit regarding criminal activities

I have a criminal conviction called harassment without violence. This conviction was given to me on 8 July 2013 at Basingstoke Magistrates. The plaintiff is my sister Viju Wortley. This criminal conviction is a trumped-up one, with procedural irregularities and I was not given appeal rights. In the chargesheet there was a statement by Viju Wortley which was signed by my brother in law Steven Wortley as "Viju Wortley " and he made a statement and signed as "Steven Wortley". I recognized the handwriting of my brother-in-law.

People said it was okay for him to sign for her as she is a frightened woman. People, especially my defence lawyer said it was okay for Viju to lie, since women normally tell a lot of lies when they win their injunction case against their husband.

Viju who never came to court or presented any evidence sent a message through the prosecutor "Mohini Hersom won't harm a fly". She had a uniformed limousine driver wait outside my home with Alex

McDowell for 1 month, until he could talk to me without needing to ring the doorbell, handed me a civil case at Reading County Court.

Her message via the limousine man was "You are going to pay and pay (money)." The civil case of Viju Wortley had recreated my life history from childhood (false details) and created a different crop of stories with \a flavour of murder. Pitman's solicitors acting for Viju Wortley in the civil case told me I would pay and pay till I could not eat, he also said Viju had paid him £6000 and was hiding on the fifth floor of the court house, while he attended with me and the judge, he said he was going up to the fifth floor to drive her home.

When she found out I had had a criminal conviction she quickly withdrew her civil case. It was 27 pages and it said "Since we were born, I was always a genius at studies and Mohini was an idiot".

I claim I do not have any other criminal record in the world than this case with Viju Wortley in my 65 years. To strengthen this claim I have accessed my criminal records check of the UK under ACRO police, and the corresponding Ireland check. That accounts for 20 years out of the 65. For your information I have applied for my I-94 records from the US. These are a complete record of when I entered and exited the US.
