Please give this communication to the plaintiff if that is allowed.

I am Mohini Hersom, the sister of Viju Wortley. On 4th July 2026, Mr Abu Sufian, barrister sent me an email saying that he would not be representing me any more, that he has advised you as well as the High Court of the same.

I had emailed you cc the High Court immediately, explaining that I am looking for a legal representative in his place.

Please read this email

Please pass on the fourth July email and this email to your client

Please wait for me to get a legal representative. If you are going to conduct any proceedings please let me know. When I'm not represented by a lawyer, I am representing myself, therefore I should have a right to know if you are filing, or doing any proceedings dispensing the estate.

I am not legally trained.

Mr Abu Sufian had pressurized me to sign a document. It did not look like a proper document. and he said contradictory things about the significance of signing it.

I have not withdrawn anything.

I need you to understand that my plaintiffs - my sister and brother-in-law have a criminal conviction called harassment without violence that was made in 2013 along with an injunction.

This criminal case prevented me coming to the UK and seeing my father before he died. This criminal case made me leave the UK. I was not forced by anybody to leave the UK, but I was on prolonged deportation appeals. and suspected that a final order might be near.

Since I've been put through too much inconvenience because of this criminal conviction, it needs to be very truthful.

Unfortunately, the lawyers have been really strange and they did not want to assist me.

I don't know the reason for this but they try to put me into a room with a woman to talk privately, and that's really not relevant in my case.

I want you (and if possible the plaintiff your client) to understand a couple of things.

When my mother died in February 2022, I was unable to travel to England to attend my mother's funeral. That is because I had made an immigration application to stay in Ireland, and I had not got my papers. Leaving the country while your application is appending voids your application. Since I did not have a right to stay or visit the UK due to the criminal conviction I could not attend my mother's funeral.

I wanted to speak to my father on the sad occasion, but he would have been insistent on knowing my address. When my mother died I did not have status in Ireland and I thought I might be refused considering my history. Well when my father knows where I am, he makes a lot of calls to officials -you know he was not an average guy- and he tried to turn them against me. I call it a very high degree of mischief. Sadly, the distinguished elder could not resist the temptation to make up life-threatening emergencies even psychiatric emergencies over the phone to an unknown voice overseas. Some folks had a stern reaction others enjoyed the saucy gossip-like distress calls. My father was a very senior official. And he used his ability and power to make calls officials in various countries. He had done it before- he had sabotaged my university courses and in the United States and Canada etc.

Naturally, if I told my father I was in Ireland, he I feared he would call the gardai and say all sorts of things. I didn't risk it.

But in March 2022 I got permission to remain in Ireland: a month after my mom died.

So there was no reason not to contact my father after that. And that's exactly what I did.

Actually within a couple of weeks when my mother's death I had made a YouTube video about my Mother which was a sort of a funeral video (it is still on YouTube which automatically dates videos when they are uploaded) and I sent it by email to my father, who told my boyfriend Alex that he saw the video.

I knew my father would be mad about not knowing my address. My father didn't like Alex -you know my mother would disapprove of any guy I was with - so Mr KV would just go on and on like that.

My father said it would be nice to have me by his bedside.

He said I was most certainly included in the will. I will never disinherit you because Viju dislikes you he said. Take that out of your head, he said. He however said he could talk to me lots when he was alone. He said he had grown weary of the world and was waiting to join Radha.

I also wanted to tell you that I was coerced by my legal representative into entering a guilty plea. I was not guilty of the harassment of Viju Wortley. I did send my brother-in-law automated newsletters to go to his work email. They were from one Islamic and one right wing website as I did not want to seem left or right wing, in fact I'm neither. I have a lot of Muslim friends but do not wish to convert. I am not a right-wing racist -makes no sense -nor is my boyfriend Alex. He is just a regular guy. in fact he is not my boyfriend because we live in separate countries since 2018 thanks to the criminal conviction.

In fact I wrote a statement before being kept overnight at Basingstoke police station, and it was stamped by a policeman. I said under oath that I did not harass Viju, only sent those newsletters as explained. The exhibits submitted by Viju for her cases are odd - I admit - but they have not the remotest reference to Viju, her children, childbearing, or mental services. They were group emails and they were not sent to Viju. My father was a recipient.

Regarding that remark that I suffered mental health problems when I studied at the University of Arizona.

I'll be 68 in August and psychiatrists existed even in India before I was born. Despite living in the UK 1981 to 1983 I did not hear the term mental health. I turned 45 when I first heard this term. I had heard of mental illness but not the imprecise term mental health. Whereas my late friend Regent was born in 1959 in the UK and had heard of mental health from the day he was born. Of course, the term is self explanatory albeit imprecise.

I can assure you that when I studied at the University of Arizona, there was not a soul uttering the term in speech or print.

there may have been a couple of students seeing a psychiatrist for depression.

Saying that I suffered mental health problems when I studied at the University of Arizona 1984 + is like saying Napoleon Bonaparte contacted his father by email - almost.

I will inform you also of something that could cause a faith crisis for some modern UK citizens. I was a graduate (post graduate) student in physics funded by the University

Graduate students in physics would not suffer from "mental health problems ", whatever that means.

I saw it printed in a UK newspaper that 25% of female University students are regularly using mental health services. The online article was reprinted, omitting the word "female".

Women are the world's mental health buffs, champions, or mental health patients, whatever that means.

But I am sure if you researched the matter, you'd find that women who study women's courses (like the humanities) would be the ones to use University mental health services to this very day.

Some people find that unacceptable. But hey, do not kill the messenger.
